# After Your Mastectomy

### **WOUND CARE INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. You will have one incision.
- 2. All stitches are buried under the skin and glue or steri-strips are used to hold the skin together. The glue will peel off. The steri-strips will fall off. If you believe the steri-strips are causing skin irritation, please notify the office.
- 3. You will come home with a pink bra. You can remove the bra in 48 hours and shower.
- 4. Apply ice pack to the incision the 1<sup>st</sup> night and as needed thereafter.
- 5. You may shower in 48 hours. Dial and Safegaurd are good antibacterial soaps to use. No creams or lotion to the wound until the glue peels off or steri-strips fall off.
- 6. Don't shave or use deodorant to the affected side for 1 week.
- 7. There may be bruising after surgery, this is normal. An intensely red, hot and tender breast is not normal and should be reported.
- 8. There may be slight drainage from the wound. Place a dry gauze or bandage on the wound to absorb drainage. Bright red blood should be reported.

#### PAIN

You will be given a prescription for hydrocodone. If your pain is not as severe, you may use extra strength Tylenol or Ibuprofen every 4-6 hours.

# **EXERCISE**

You may use your arm on the affected side. No lifting greater than **10** pounds, reaching above shoulder level or strenuous activity until the drains are removed.

Begin American Cancer Society exercises after drains are removed.

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#### WORK

You may return to work in 4-6 weeks. Possibly sooner with sedentary job.

## **DRAIN REMOVAL**

Call the office for appointment in 5 days for drain removal. Drains will be removed with output is **less than 40 mL for 24-hour period**.

### AT YOUR FOLLOW UP APPOINTMENT

At your follow up appointment, we will discuss your pathology. We will discuss scheduling appointments with a medical oncologist and radiation oncologist. You will need to heal at least 3 weeks before you begin radiation therapy or chemotherapy, should that be indicated.

#### When to call the doctor:

- Fever greater than 100.5 orally.
- Increasing pain at the incision site.
- Large amount of drainage that is soaking the bandage.
- If the area around the incision becomes red, inflamed, or foul smelling.
